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#### ANNEXURE-I

#### Note on the Process of Due Diligence

We are the Lead Manager to the proposed SME IPO of Shri Kanha Stainless Limited (the "Company") has conducted the Due Diligence of the Company, we hereby submit a brief note on the due diligence process adopted by us:

#### Current Business Background:

We have interacted with the management team of Shri Kanha Stainless Limited to understand their business. Operations and their focus areas. As a part of our Due-diligence exercise, we have verified the documents pertaining to the business. We have also interacted with Key Managerial Personnel to understand the business operation/process carried out by the company. As discussed, and understood the company's business operations, we have depicted the same in the chapter titled "Our Business" of the Prospectus.

#### Risk Factor:

We have studied the sector in which the company operates in, and the risk associated with it. While the risks are an inherent part of any system, we have put forth the risk associated with the company and its business operations and other general risks. We believe that the risk (which we are aware of and have been made aware of and have discovered during the Due Diligence process) has been put forth in the Prospectus

#### Promoter Background:

The current promoters are Mr. Jai Bhagwan Agarwal, Mrs. Kavita Agarwal, Mr. Shashank Agrawal and Mrs. Neha Agarwal. We have interacted with the promoters and have discussed with them the past performance of the company and how they foresee business growth, more particularly after the issue. We have as a part of our due diligence exercise, have perused through the documents relating to the promoters and directors, which is disclosed in the chapter titled "Our Management" and "Our Promoters and Promoter Groups"

#### Company's History and Track Record:

Disclosures in the track record of the company, its evolution and history are based on the verification of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, Audited Financial Statement, Annual Returns etc.

#### Steps of our entire Due Diligence exercise

- Preparation of a complete checklist of information required from the Company Starting from its Organization Structure, Charter documents, Secretarial records, Financial Statements and Annual Reports, Management and Shareholding details, Information relating to related party transactions, various agreements which the Company has entered during the ordinary course of its business, borrowing status, pending investigations/applications etc.
- 2 Complete verification of documents shared by the Company and seeking information wherever required
- 3 Visiting the Registered office and having a wave of meetings physically and virtually with them.
- Advising them on the good governance practices and future course of action in maintenance of records as per Companies Act, 2013, SEBI Regulations etc.

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- An examination being achieved by asking certain questions, through which certain risks have been identified by us relating to the Company. Few of them which may impact the business of the Company are:
- a. Any change in regulatory environment
- b. Delay or default in payment by the customers
- c. Regional hostilities or other acts of violence or war involving India and other countries
- d. Rapid advancement within the industry in which the company operates and inability to keep pace with the change

We have examined originals or where that was not possible copies, certified or otherwise, of such documents, corporate records, certificates from public officials and other instruments as we have deemed relevant to the Issue. In such examination, we have assumed the genuineness of all signatures, the authenticity of all documents and records submitted to us as originals and the conformity with the originals of all documents and records submitted to us as copies thereof.

We have relied on the Certifications or Undertakings provided by the Management of the Company, Statutory Auditors, Legal Advisor to the Issue and other Advisors/Consultants if any for various disclosures in the Prospectus.


